Job Title: Endocrine Specialist Nurse

We are looking for an Endocrine Specialist Nurse, with experience and interest predominantly in pituitary conditions, to join our charity's Support Services Team.

You will be responsible for helping to deliver our telephone Endocrine Nurse Helpline Service. This post will be 7 hours per week\*, worked over one or two Helpline shifts, consisting of approximately five hours duration each shift. (Candidate availability will be borne in mind when agreeing working patterns).

The flexibility of the hours offered could be helpful for those candidates who wish also to continue in clinical practice.

The Nurse will be the joint clinical lead amongst our staff team and will be part of the organisation's Medical Committee. The role also includes working closely with the Head of Support Services to provide medical information and guidance and contribute overall to the charity's Support Services.

Applicants are required to have:

- Proven experience as an Endocrine Specialist Nurse, predominantly in pituitary disease process/treatments and replacement hormone therapy.
- Minimum of three years' post registration experience.
- Warm, approachable telephone manner and experience of delivering support in this way.
- Ability to work unsupervised and to make decisions.
- Up-to-date NMC registration.

## Job purpose

The Endocrine Specialist Nurse will help deliver our Endocrine Nurse Helpline Service. The Nurse will be joint clinical lead amongst the staff team and is part of the organisation's Medical Committee. The role includes working closely with the Head of Support Services and other Endocrine Specialist Nurse(s), to provide medical information and guidance and contribute overall to the charity's support services.

## Key responsibilities

**Endocrine Nurse Telephone Helpline** 

- Provide Telephone Helpline support, information and guidance.
- Keep a log of all calls taken and made, with any follow up, and send them to National Support Office (NSO) on a monthly basis, as agreed with the Head of Support Services.
- Provide feedback to the Head of Support Services on queries, views etc received through the Endocrine Nurse Helpline.

### **Support Services**

- Support the Head of Support Services with medical related enquiries received through the Helpline, Email Support Service and other services.
- Contribute to magazine articles, booklets and other Foundation publications as needed.
- Present occasional online events for our community
- Input into policy, research and campaigns work, as and when required.
- Actively assist the Head of Support Services with the planning and development of relevant aspects of Support Services.

#### Other

Produce monthly report of activities for CEO and any other reports as and when required.
